Dear Friends in Christ,

What a day today has turned out to be!

When I came in to the office this morning, I was expecting to write a wedding sermon and then work on the weekend's sermon. I was expecting to answer several emails and make a few phone calls. In other words, I was expecting it to be a rather quiet day in the office.

Apparently God had other plans...

Instead, I spent time with a person who was facing open heart surgery in the morning and who was understandably rather tense about the whole thing. I spent time with the spouse of a person who is slowly sinking into dementia and who has been struggling to cope. I spent time with a long-time member who is now under hospice care. I spent time with a person who is facing a new life in a nursing home after years of living on their own. I spent time with a person whose spouse passed away not too long ago and is now trying to find their own path in life. I spent time with a new mom setting up a baptism for her child. I spent time with a person who is leaving the area to be closer to family.

Interruptions? Well, I suppose in some sense some people would call them that, but if they were interruptions, they were holy interruptions. Why would I call them 'holy interruptions?' Because each of them contained holy moments, moments of God's special presence in our lives:

- as I listened and shared prayer with the person facing heart surgery, a sense of peace and calm came upon all of us in the room together;
- as I listened and lifted to God the concerns of the spouse, a sense of renewed hope and a lifting of spirits seemed to envelope us;
- as I shared scripture and prayer with our hospice member, there was the memory of a long life blessed by God in so many ways;
- as I sat with our member new to a nursing home, I heard the fears of the unknown come out, and together we were able to call on God's courage and strength for meeting the days ahead;
- as I sat and listened to the person whose spouse recently died, I heard stories of the happier times when they were together; I could see how important it was for the spouse to remember those times and be able to smile;
- as I planned a baptism for a new child of God's own creation, I remembered how God has come and claimed us as God's very own without our doing a thing to earn such a gift of salvation;
- as I heard the anticipation and joy of the person moving closer to family, I also heard a compassionate and caring story of faith in action, putting the needs of those she cared for above her own immediate needs.

Interruptions? How can I possibly call the moments when God reveals God's own loving self through the presence of the Holy Spirit mere 'interruptions?!?' These were holy moments, moments of God sharing God's gracious gifts of comfort and courage, hope and strength, peace and

joy, compassion and caring with God's own people. These weren't interruptions at all, but truly blessings to be shared.

Why do I share these with you? For two reasons:

1. To give you hope and peace in believing, that, when your time of need comes, you will know that God will bless you as well with the Spirit's gracious presence, and

2. To say 'thank you' on behalf of those who experienced these holy moments for your support of Trinity's mission and ministry. If it weren't God at work through your volunteering, your gifts, your words of encouragement, these 'blessed interruptions' wouldn't be possible.

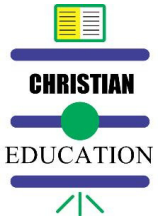
