Dear Friends in Christ,

September is the beginning of a new journey in many ways. A lot of the programs here at church are starting up again: Sunday School, Confirmation Classes, Adult Bible Studies, choir and handbell rehearsals, and more.

But there's another beginning of a new journey that you should probably be aware of. It's the beginning of a new journey to seek out God's vision for mission and ministry in and through our congregation. The questions we will be asking ourselves are deep and profound:

We often go to Scripture for answers and inspiration, which is always appropriate. Sometimes inspiration comes in another form based on Scripture's word, but put into new words and new forms. There is a hymn in our hymnals, *When The Poor Ones*, that has inspired me to ask these questions and seek answers from our Lord. Maybe this hymn creates a model of what the Church is called to be. Maybe the words will inspire you as well to be more intentional about your faith and how you live your life because of it.

In the hope of you finding inspiration for your faith and all it can be, I share some of the words from the hymn:

*When compassion gives the suffering consolation;
When expecting brings to birth hope that was lost;
When we choose love, not the hatred all around us:
We see God, here by our side, walking our way.*

*When our spirits, like a chalice, brim with gladness;
When our voices, full and clear, sing out the truth;
When our longings, free from envy, seek the humble:
We see God, here by our side, walking our way.*

*When the goodness poured from heaven fills our dwellings;
When the nations work to change war into peace;
When the stranger is accepted as our neighbor:
We see God, here by our side, walking our way.*

It is my hope and prayer that our new journey will bring us to the day when we, too, see God, here by our side, walking our way.

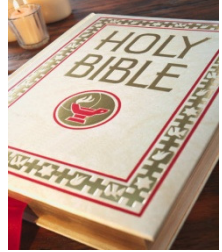
PIE BAKING EVENT

THRIVENT CHOICE DOLLARS

Things have changed rather dramatically in the way Thrivent Financial for Lutherans distributes their financial support to Lutheran congregations and institutions. In years past, congregations would apply to Thrivent for a grant based on certain criteria, and if the funds were available, Thrivent would award the grant. Our congregation has benefitted from Thrivent support of the Meatball Supper, Join Hands Day, and Community Caring programs.

The new method Thrivent is using for allocating their charitable donations is through the '*Choice Dollars*' program for Thrivent members. Each Thrivent member has recently received a letter indicating how much money they have in their '*Choice Dollars*' accounts. In order to donate that money, each Thrivent member has to tell Thrivent where they want their '*Choice Dollars*' to go.

If you are a Thrivent member, you have recently received a letter from Thrivent indicating how much is in your designated '*Choice Dollars*' account. There are also directions on how to designate TLC as your ministry of choice for these benevolence funds.

How do you designate your Thrivent Choice Dollars? You can do it online:

1. Go to www.Thrivent.com
2. In the upper right corner, sign in
3. Go to Thrivent Community and click on Thrivent Choice in menu
4. Then choose Direct Choice Dollars
5. Search for TLC by name, city, state and type of ministry
 - a. Trinity Lutheran Church
 - b. South Milwaukee
 - c. WI
 - d. Congregation
6. At that point, you can decide if you want to do a one time donation or a recurring donation of your '*Choice Dollars*.'

This is your chance to designate where your Thrivent support goes. Any funds in your '*Choice Dollars*' account that you do NOT designate will be designated as Thrivent sees fit. It is our plan to set the Thrivent donations aside from our regular budget so the money can be used as it has in the past to support special events within the congregation and in our communities.

NEW BOOK REVIEWS FROM YOUR TRINITY LIBRARY:

Life Is What You Make It - Find Your Own Path to Fulfillment

by Peter Buffett, Publisher: Crown Archetype, hardcover, 272 pages

From composer, musician, and philanthropist Peter Buffett comes a warm, wise, and inspirational book that asks, Which will you choose: the path of least resistance or the path of potentially greatest satisfaction? You may think that with a last name like his, Buffett has enjoyed a life of endless privilege. But the son of billionaire investor Warren Buffett says that the only real inheritance handed down from his parents was a philosophy: Forge your own path in life. It is a creed that has allowed him to follow his own passions, establish his own identity, and reap his own successes.

Buffett, who once called Milwaukee home, expounds on the strong set of values given to him by his trusting and broadminded mother, his industrious and talented father, and the many life teachers he has met along the way. Today's society, Buffett posits, has begun to replace a work ethic, relishing what you do, with a wealth ethic, honoring the payoff instead of the process. We confuse privilege with material accumulation, character with external validation. Yet, by focusing more on substance and less on reward, we can open doors of opportunity and strive toward a

greater sense of fulfillment. From there it becomes easy to recognize the equal dignity and value of every human life—our circumstances may vary but our essences do not.
