Dear Friends in Christ,

Whatever happened to life slowing down in summer? I think the world has changed so much that life seems to speed up and become more intense during the summer. Summer sports seem to have expanded until they run from school's out to back-to-school. Summer school itself has expanded to cover most of the summer months. Time off is hard to come by, and then seems to be swallowed by stuff around the house we've put off for months until we had a free moment. Even leisure time seems to be as demanding as anything else. We have often heard someone comment after a week of vacation: 'I had to come back to work so I could rest!'

I know I'm as guilty as the rest of the world. I seem to be flying from one project to another, from repairing something at home to getting my garden planted. Add into that a family wedding (Meghan is marrying Keven), extended family coming in for the wedding, a family re-location (Josh has been reassigned to Racine as an Air Force recruiter), birthdays all over the place during the summer, and more. There are times I don't know if I'm coming or going!

In the midst of all this is a need to stay connected to God through it all. It is only in that connection that all my other connections with family and friends and parish members can be strengthened, renewed and refreshed.

Admittedly, sometimes it's a real struggle to stay connected to God with so much going on around us. The first and foremost solution is to stay intentional about spending time with God. It's was said of Martin Luther that he would get up each morning and pray for an hour before beginning his day, and if he had a

particularly important and busy day planned, he would pray for 3 hours before setting out.

I don't think any of us can live up to Luther's example, but we can live out his intentionality. We can be intentional about spending some time with God on a daily and a weekly basis. Every day, we can read a bit of Scripture, read a devotional note and spend some time in prayer. Every week, we can spend time in serving others and attending one of TLC's worship services scattered through the week.

These are not impossible things to work into our already hectic schedules. They're things that ground us and help us keep our schedules and our connections with others grounded as well. They need to be intentional because they're so easy to put on the back burner to pick up again when we have more time. We'll never have more time than what God has granted us already!

I hope your summer plans are coming together well for you, and that you plan to stay connected to God and God's people in your planning.

## **MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT**

Hello, last month I wrote about a pitchfork, messy rooms, colleges and change. And while change always happens, whatever change you experience, your Church and Congregation are there for you and offer many ways for you to connect with Christ.

I'm still thinking about change this month, specifically the pace of change. Looking back it seems some things change very quickly, like kids growing up and going off to college. Other times it seems change is very slow, for example, it seems to take forever to change from our perpetually cold Wisconsin spring to summer.

In May a number of people from Trinity worked to build a Habitat for Humanity house. Talk about quick change, in one week members of our Congregation put up all the walls, put in the windows, got the second floor framed and set the roof trusses of a home. Normally we would have the roof and siding done but we really only worked three days because of rain-outs. For us it was a few quick days of work and in my case a few banged fingers, (I don't think Pastor missed a nail once, you should see him swing a hammer!). For the people who will move into the finished house their change took a long time. They had to first go through a qualification process that took months and included interviews and classes and working on other people's houses even before they got to work on their own house. I've worked on three houses in the last two years and each time the new homeowners stop in to watch the work and see the progress, and each time it is moving to see them stand and talk and dream about who will be in this room or that room when they move in.

Habitat for Humanity and Thrivent have built over 450 homes in the last five years. Think about the positive change the new homes, with committed homeowners, have for a neighborhood. Members of Trinity have been part of that change. Think about how the committed action of some people, over a short period of time, have a big impact and make big changes in lives over a long period of time.

I have seen that committed action from members of Trinity many times before, both in short periods of time ( think of serving breakfasts, participating in parades and food pantries) and over many months and years (think of Sunday School Teachers and building projects). I think in

every one of those actions there has been positive change and a positive impact in someone's life.

I started this column talking about the change we experience as individuals, how that change is focused on us and how Our Church offers a lot to us as individuals. I ended talking about the change we participate in and how that change is focused on others. God asks us, here Pastor would probably say commands us, to focus on others. You, with others in our Congregation, can be part of positive change in God's world. Think about that next time you hear the word change.

The Caring Ministry would like to invite you to participate in a new charity project. We will be collecting fabric and notions to make pillowcases for ConKerr Cancer, a charity that donates pillowcases to Children's Hospital patients. These pillowcases provide comfort and fun for children and teens who are facing prolonged hospital stays. Milwaukee's Children's Hospital is currently not receiving donations, so we are hoping that Trinity will be able to start a program for our own local kids. ## **What's Happening in Your Trinity Library:**

For the past three years, we have been adding books, CDs, and DVDs to our church library, with the support of both money from the church budget as well as individual donations. The library has grown with the addition of 120 items since December, 2006! Our library usage has increased tremendously as well, which is very encouraging, to know that church members are being blessed with the availability of relevant video & literature.

For those of you who have not recently taken advantage of using our library, here's a review of how to check out & return items:

When checking out a book, look inside the back cover for the check out card. For CDs and DVDs the check out card is usually on the back of the disc case. Fill in the date you are taking the item along with your first & last name. There are two places to deposit the check out card after it's filled in, either in the green box found on the shelves with the books in the narthex, or in the green box on the desk in the library.

When returning an item, please place it in the green return bin which is on the lowest shelf in the library. Returning items to this bin expedites getting the items back into circulation.
