We're going to have to make some decisions pretty soon!

Will it be just a card? Some flowers? Some chocolate? A dinner out? Dinner and a movie? A quiet night at home? What are we going to do to honor the Valentine's Day tradition of showing the person we love and who (hopefully) loves us?

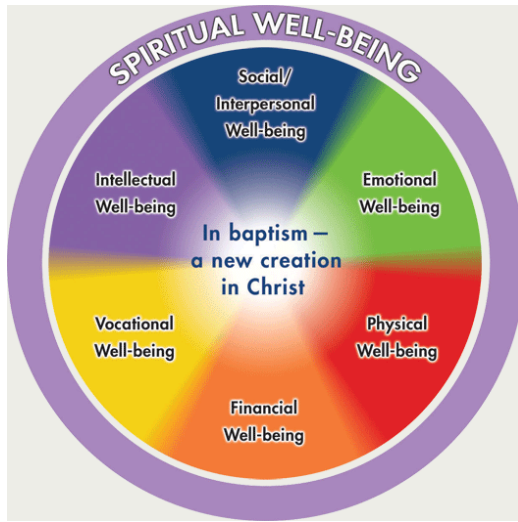
Maybe the best of all Valentine's Day gifts is the gift of time. Heaven knows we're busier than ever! Ask someone how they're doing, and you're likely to get the answer, "I'm busy!" The gift of taking a break from being 'busy' (whatever that might mean for you and your family) may be the most significant gift you can give to those you love!

Imagine, for a moment, scheduling a time to take a break from all the stuff you do and just spend time with your loved ones? How long would it take you to relax from the stress of the normal daily routine so you can really enjoy the time together?

I believe God calls us to find a balance in our lives. I've noticed that when I'm too busy and not getting enough rest, I'm not at my best. When I'm running the rat race and not getting time to exercise, I can feel the drain on my physical self. When I'm going from event to event to event, I can feel the distance in my closest relationships. When I'm focused on getting things accomplished, I'm missing the opportunity just to be.

Many of our health insurance providers have started major emphases on health and well-being as a way to bring health care costs into line with reality. The idea is that if we're working to stay healthier, we'll spend less money on restoring our health.

My health care provider came up with a Wellness Wheel as a way to get the message across to church leaders all over the country. It emphasizes a balance between several aspects of our lives: social, intellectual, emotional, physical, financial and vocational. As these areas of our lives come into balance, we discover that our Spiritual Well-being is also balanced. As we become spiritually whole, we can focus on the center: being a new creation in Jesus Christ.



Maybe Valentine's Day can be the first day you are intentional about finding a balance. Make it a day to set aside some time simply to be with loved ones. Keep it simple: no extravagant meals, no inappropriate costs, no crowded schedules; just balance your day with those you love.

Do it a couple of times during February, not just on Valentine's Day. How does it feel? Can you sense a new kind of balance in your life? Be careful!! It's how I think God wants us to live. You may get to like it!

## **ADULT BIBLE STUDIES**

TLC has two adult Bible studies going at the moment, with a possible 3<sup>rd</sup> one in the works for Lent. Here's an idea of what we have going on:

Thursday morning Bible Study - meets at 10:30 AM in Rooms 112-113 for an hour of fellowship and study. This class has focused on the upcoming Gospel lesson for the following Sunday. We average about 12-14 adults at each class. February's scheduled lessons include:

Sunday Adult Forum - meets between worship services on Sunday morning, starting at 9:15 in Rooms 109-110. This Bible study has been very different, in that we have been looking at a wide variety of scripture passages, many of them suggested by the students themselves. The theme has been to look at biblical sayings or events that are difficult to understand. Each week focuses on a different portion of the Bible, so there is no need to be in class every week to understand what's going on. We don't even schedule the lessons more than a week in advance. What's in the works? How about an hour-long Lenten Bible study on Wednesday afternoons at 1:30 PM, beginning Ash Wednesday and leading up to Holy Week?

Lent has traditionally been a time of spiritual self-searching and the disciplines of faith. In addition to his letter to the Romans, Paul's letter to the Galatians is probably the clearest proclamation of God's salvation by grace through faith in Jesus Christ. Spending an hour a week remembering the center of our faith would make a good Lenten discipline.

The schedule for this 6 week long Bible study will be in the March newsletter. We're inviting people to let Pastor Bill know if you hope to attend by signing up. The deadline will be Sunday, March 6.

## **MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT**

Renter or Owner?

That was the theme of Pastor Bill's sermon on January 8<sup>th</sup>. If you rent a car you don't change the oil on it or rotate the tires, you don't work on that rental car because you are just using the car for a short time. You really don't care that much about the rental car. If you own a house you work to keep it painted and fixed up because you are going to be in it for a long time, you don't want it to fall apart and devalue. Pastor's question in the sermon was are you a renter at Church or an owner? Do you just show up at Church, rent it for an hour on Sunday and then leave? Or do you work at keeping up the Church, owning the Church, helping to keep it strong and built to last?

We want more Owners at Church. We want people to work to keep the Church and the Ministries strong, not just show up for an hour on Sunday. I have been on the Church Council, off and on (mostly on) for close to 20 years. Over those 20 years the Council talked a lot about how to get more congregation members involved, to be Owners. I'll bet that conversation happened at every other meeting, or it seemed like it. We tried different things to increase participation like Pastor making direct pleas for volunteers, temple talks about the need for help, we asked the Ministry Teams to find their own team members and then the Council to try to find volunteers. Over the years we have had mixed success. In the last two cases, we found

people were very busy trying to do the actual Ministry Team or Church work so they didn't have time to look for volunteers.

Now we are going to take a very focused approach. In recognition of how critically important it is to the Church to have Owners, a new Ministry Team has been created, the Stewardship Team. The goals of other Ministry Teams are more activity driven, for example the Outreach Team tries to get TLC's name out in the community and let people know we are here. The mission of the Stewardship Team will be to coordinate our stewardship efforts, in this case stewardship refers to how we serve the Church with our time, talents and financial support. The new Team will focus on finding volunteers (Owners) through the Time and Talents process and other initiatives, and then connect those volunteers with the Ministry Teams and leaders of various special events. The Team will also focus on stewardship of our money, coordinating the offering pledge drive in fall. The Stewardship Team has already changed some things, taking a different approach to the Time and Talents sheets this last fall and assisting with the fall pledge drive.

TLC is, after all, our Church. We decide what Pastor to call to be our spiritual leader, we decide on the ministry programs and budget. We need to decide to be Owners.

## **FIRST COMMUNION - PLANNING AHEAD**

Each year, TLC holds a First Communion class for all those who are preparing to receiving Holy Communion for the first time. This year's class will be on **Saturday, February 26, from 9 AM to noon**. As in years past, a parent or other closely related adult must attend with the child.

Young people are prepared for receiving Holy Communion through a historical look at the roots of Communion and its connection with the Passover, through a biblical look at our Lord's Last Supper, and a practical exposure to the materials and methods we use in celebrating Holy Communion.
