MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

Christmas and Easter.

We have just celebrated Easter. When I was a kid I liked Christmas better. What was not to like? Thanksgiving was sort of a pre-holiday, holiday where we took a few days off to relax before getting into the Christmas spirit. Then there would be four or five weeks of constant advertising on TV about toys and presents, special toy catalogs arriving daily and parties at school and at friends houses and other relatives houses with candies and cookies and sweets. Those were weeks of fantasizing and day dreaming about presents while eating cookies. There was usually a church service on Christmas Day. Then there was a week off of school to play with your new toys and see your friend's new toys, and then there was the post-holiday, holiday of New Years Day with more special food and cookies and sweets. Like I said, what's not to like?

Easter was a little different; there was not as much in the media, no special catalogs, no toys or presents to hype for four or five weeks. We had to go to church in the middle of the week for a number of weeks and the message was more somber, lots of tension and talk about death leading up to a big event. Then during Holy Week it seemed like there were services every day. And on Easter Sunday we got up really early to make the sunrise service. Sure when you got home there were Easter baskets to find, with jelly beans and chocolate bunnies to eat (I never got the bunnies Easter connection), then a big family dinner. From a kid's point of view (this kid), Easter was ok but Christmas was cool.

This view was not shared by my Mother. Yes, my Mother enjoyed Christmas very much but Easter got her "amped up", which in the current lingo means very, very excited. Mom would go to every service, read the Lenten devotions and plan the Easter celebration. Then on Easter Sunday, she would look forward (really!) to that sunrise service, sing every one of those hymns at

the top of her lungs and greet everyone she saw with “*He is risen!, Hallelujah!!*” (some of you may not know that my Father was a Pastor, Christmas and Easter are very busy times for Pastors with extra services to coordinate and extra sermons to prepare; Pastors enjoy Christmas and Easter, they just tend to be a little more focused on the logistics of things).

As an adult I finally understood what got Mom all “amped up”. I understand now why we have weeks of Lenten services, why this is a time of reflection and why Holy Week is Holy. Yes Christmas is important, and fun, and it’s still cool.

Easter, though, is the main event. Easter is why we are saved, why we are forgiven and why we are called Christians. I think I may have said those same words last year. I don’t think I said “*He is risen! Hallelujah!*”

TRINITY SCHOLARSHIP NEWS

Scholarship applications became available March 13, 2011 with a deadline for submission on May 1st. The decision on Scholarship Awards will be made May 10th.

The scholarship application form details the criteria for awarding scholarships, and it is also noted below:

1. Applicants are active in the life of the congregation through worship, receiving the sacraments, continuing education (Sunday School, Bible Study, Campus Ministry programs), youth events, and volunteer work.
2. Applicants are accepted or enrolled as a full time student to attend classes on a campus of a Lutheran seminary, Lutheran college, or other accredited colleges and universities.
3. Applicants are seeking a degree at one of the following levels:
 - Associate Degree
 - Bachelor Degree
 - Master Degree
 - Ph D
4. Applicants may receive one scholarship from Trinity Lutheran church for each degree he/she is pursuing. If an applicant is not successful in receiving a scholarship in a given year, he/she may apply the following year.

New Reviews from your Trinity Library:

Real Faith for Real Life

Michael W. Foss, Augsburg Books,
paperback, 140 pages

For Christians seeking to apply their faith to everyday life, this book invites readers to answer the call of discipleship and provides guidance and examples of how to do so successfully. Michael Foss encourages readers to rely on six time-tested marks of discipleship that encourage the practice of faith in everyday life: daily prayer, bible reading, weekly worship, Christian service, relationships that encourage spiritual growth, and giving in the spirit of generosity.

Using bible passages and real-life stories, Foss illustrates how each mark of discipleship enhances and supports the growth of a person's faith journey. This book also includes study questions and journaling suggestions for small group discussion and individual reflection.

Author Michael W. Foss serves as Senior Pastor of St. Mark Lutheran Church in West Des Moines, IA. A graduate of Pacific Lutheran University, Michael Foss earned his master of divinity from Wartburg Theological Seminary, Dubuque, Iowa, and a master's in theology and spirituality from Mount Angel Benedictine Seminary, Mount Angel, OR. Pastor Foss consults and speaks to leaders with synods, church organizations and other denominations about identifying, equipping, and commissioning

effective Christian leaders for the 21st century ministry.
