TRINITY'S ANNUAL CONGREGATION MEETING

Each year, the congregation meets together to hear reports from the nine ministry teams, the pastor and other groups within the church, get a report from the treasurer, elect members to the Church Council and other boards, teams and committees, and set the budget and ministry goals for the new year. This year's Annual Meeting of the congregation will be on **Sunday, January 29** after the second service.

Annual Reports for 2011 will be available to the congregation a week earlier, on January 21 and 22. Reports from ministry teams, boards, committees, auditors, auxiliaries and staff to be included in the 2011 Annual Report are due in to the church office on or before Friday, January 13.

CARING MINISTRY TEAM

The Caring Ministry Team is facilitating a sheet drive for the La Causa Center in Milwaukee. Twin size sheets and crib sheets may be donated throughout December and January. The La Causa Crisis Nursery/Child Care center which serves Milwaukee's children at risk for homelessness and



violence. This shelter operates 365 days a year/24hrs a day; taking in children in need, no questions asked of whomever drops them off. While the shelter has so many needs, this year with your help,

I am hoping we can collect enough new, twin sheets to replace what the children currently sleep on. The sheets they use now are threadbare--many with holes. The shelter has 18 twin beds --9 girl, and 9 boy; which get the most use, and 5 cribs. The volunteers who work there wash the bedding multiple times a day, between each child's use.

NOTE FROM PASTOR BILL

Dear Friends in Christ,

Another year has turned. If you're reading this, you've turned another year older. The results of our previous choices in life are probably driving our decisions and directions. What we've decided to spend our money and time on seem to dictate how we spend our money and time now. It seems like we've gotten ourselves into a rut and then we start to feel helpless about changing the situation.

I wonder if this is where New Year's resolutions came from? With the turning of the calendar page to a new year, there seems to be a sense of a fresh start, a new opportunity to do things differently. There's a problem, though. If we just say we're going to do something differently, but aren't aware of what got us into the rut in the first place, our resolutions we won't have much staying power.

For example, if there's a desire in us to have the newest and best of things all the time, then resolving to spend less and save more probably isn't going to happen. If there's a desire to have our kids involved in everything possible, then resolving to spend more time with our spouse probably isn't going to happen. If we're addicted to recreational activities, then resolving to spend more time in worship or prayer or reading Scripture probably isn't going to happen.

I believe resolutions are great things, but they have to be preceded by some reflection in order to be successful. That time spent in reflection on who we are and how did we get here can lead to resolutions that are realistic and attainable.

The scale has informed me that I haven't been watching what I eat as well as I used to. When I reflected on why that was, I realized I haven't been taking the time to pack a balanced lunch, instead opting for a 'fast food' meal. I also realized things were too hectic getting everyone out the door on time for school and work. In order for me to get to my best weight, I need to do more than resolve to watch what I eat. I need to resolve to be better prepared each morning so I have time to be intentional about what I eat.

My kids have reminded me that we haven't had much time for family devotions and prayers. When I reflected on this, I realized we've all let other things crowd into our family meal times, the best time for being together and for sharing our faith. We need to resolve to make being together a priority, and to make our faith a priority when we're together.

Does this sound all too familiar to you? During the turning of this year, take some time to reflect on where you are and how you got there. Spend some time in prayer, asking God for wisdom and insight and guidance. Work on one resolution at a time, making sure it's attainable, and then lay out the steps needed to make it happen. Be it weight or worship time or making contact with family members or whatever, a little realistic reflection make a resolution more than a wish.

May God bless you richly in this New Year, with the gifts you need to practice your faith and live your life in keeping with God's good and gracious will. Happy New Year!

MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

Dear Uncle Willard,

Hello it's me, your third-favorite nephew, writing the Christmas letter to you again this year. First say "hi" to Aunt Gertrude from Sandy, your favorite niece, and me. We hope you are both well and enjoying Florida. We had typical Wisconsin weather in 2011, a winter with no snow for weeks, then we wake up with 4 foot drifts of the white stuff in the driveway, a cold spring, a warm and sometimes very hot summer, and now a nice fall.

You always ask about Church so here is the update of goings-on at Trinity for the past year:

- Sunday School continues to be a vibrant program for the Church and that is reflected in good attendance numbers. We continue to have an amazing group of volunteers from the Congregation who work hard to run that program and be teachers to the kids.
- The coordination of the Meatball Supper was passed to a new set of volunteers and just like every year, the food was great, service wonderful, and the place was filled.
- We now hold Healing Services about four times a year. That is a special, short service where Pastor offers healing blessings to anyone for any "hurt".
- Our Outreach Team is coordinating the selling of pies once a month at the South Milwaukee Farmer's Market. I think they are using one of Aunt Gertrude's recipes because they sell out all the pies in less than two hours.
- And still speaking of food, about once every three months, our Caring Ministry Team coordinates serving breakfast at a Homeless shelter.
- Aunt Gertrude would love the beat of the *Soul Purpose* band as they rock the house playing at worship services a couple times a month. *Soul Purpose* also played in the South Milwaukee Heritage Days parade and they put on a great fall concert which originally started out as something for confirmation kids but now draws three times as many adults as kids.
- There is some activity for every age group at *least* once a month in the Youth Ministry; that program is growing and

strong. AND this year some of the high school kids went to New York City where they worked on service projects and got to see Ground Zero. I think they'll remember that trip for a long time.

- Speaking of activities, our Congregational Life Team has put a lot of work into having fun! They organize and coordinate fun family and group events that focus on social activities with members of the congregation.
- Worship Service continues to be the strong bedrock of the Church. Our Worship and Music Ministry Team works hard to coordinate the services. You would be proud of the Choir, Uncle Willard, they do a very nice job – so nice that once in a while we forget we are Lutherans and we actually clap after they sing. The Bell Choir is one of my favorites, there is just something special about the sweet tones they make.
- And speaking of proud, Aunt Gertrude would be proud of the way the Church looked when it was time to bless the Quilts; every pew in the Church was covered by a quilt during the service; then those were packed and sent to people in need. Just think of all the hard work people put into those quilts!
- Vacation Bible School had another strong year with good attendance. I know it is hard to find teachers for weekdays during the summer but again, the Education Ministry Team worked very hard to put together a great program with great teachers.
- Speaking of hard work, the Property Team had a very busy year. They coordinated the re-roofing of the Church, which was a *really* big project; they worked with the Stewardship Team to start building an all-Ministry Team Communication and Display area in the Narthex and they kept the rest of the building running.
- I mentioned the Stewardship Team, they have evolved out of the Finance Team and they now help other Teams with different projects, like working with the Property Team on the roof projects. Also the Stewardship Team has really changed the way we approach our pledges of time and talents and money, trying to get people to think about their different blessings before considering what they would contribute to the Church.

- I shared last year that we had a tough time financially but we came through ok. We had the same situation this year, things were tight but the Finance Team worked hard and did a great job with budgets, coordinating expenses and letting the Congregation know the up-to-date status of things. At the end of the year we ended up ok, again.

As I look back over what I have written I gave a lot of examples of things we did last year, still, I know I missed many examples of the ways we try to bring God's Word into this world and I probably missed mentioning some of the groups of people who worked on those projects. I also see I've repeated the phrase "hard work" a lot. We do have a lot of people who put one of the most valuable things they have – time – into running our Church. Last year I wrote about the challenge of getting more people involved and how we learned that some people are afraid to sign up for Church commitments because something else might come up. And last year I remembered your quote "if you are part of the family you share in the chores". The Stewardship Team, and all the Ministry Teams, continue to try and find ways to get others involved in the activities we do and projects we run. That is all we can do, right? To keep trying and keep asking.

It's easy to get overwhelmed if you're trying to read the Bible on a daily basis. People often complain that they don't know what to read, don't remember to do it on a regular basis, or don't understand what they're reading.

Here's a resolution for 2012 that might be easy to keep. How about resolving to read the Bible 14 times every month? You won't have to worry if you've missed a day. You'll know what to read and you'll have a pretty good idea what it's about.

Here's January's *14 Readings* on the life and teachings of Jesus:

1. Luke 1 - getting ready for Jesus' arrival
2. Luke 2 - the story of Jesus' birth
3. Mark 1 - Jesus' ministry gets started
4. Mark 9 - a day in the life of Jesus
5. Matthew 5 - the sermon on the mount, part 1
6. Matthew 6 - the sermon on the mount, part 2
7. Luke 15 - several of Jesus' parables
8. John 3 - Nicodemus has a conversation with Jesus
9. John 14 - Jesus' gives final instructions to his followers
10. John 17 - Jesus prays for his followers
11. Matthew 26 - Jesus is betrayed and arrested
12. Matthew 27 - Jesus is crucified on a cross
13. John 20 - Jesus' resurrection
14. Luke 24 - Jesus appears to his disciples after his resurrection

February's *14 Readings* will be a quick run through some of the more important stories of the Old Testament. Future *14 Readings* will focus on the prayers in the Bible, the Holy Spirit, women and men in the Bible, social justice and more.
